Presbyterians love to gather both as a church family and with friends in the broader community. Fun and fellowship events are held on a regular basis including themed dinners such as the ever popular Irish Night. Our annual Christmas Bake and Craft Sale is also a big hit in the community.

Often, the net proceeds of paid events go to

support local charities such as the food bank and the hospice.

Our Worship Team holds services at the community's retirement residence and the adjacent nursing home. The Men's Group organize events, such as the hot chocolate stand at the annual Santa Claus parade. They also get together monthly for fellowship and a hearty breakfast at a local family restaurant.

One intrepid member looks after an extensive library for those looking for Christian-themed reading material. Another heads up a prayer team and organizes a collective prayer for those going through difficult times.

Elders are in regular contact with their members to both help celebrate good news and to offer comfort in times of need. Many individual members are also actively engaged in pastoral care, visitations and other outreach activities.

Presbyterians have been serving the Scugog area for over 160 years. St. John's Presbyterian Church held its first Sunday service on January 3, 1869 at our current location on Queen Street in Port Perry.

What to expect at our Sunday service?

Our services are held upstairs in our sanctuary. For those that need it, a small elevator is available to access the upper floor of our building.

Entering the sanctuary, you hear the buzz of friendly chatter interspersed with laughter. Some mornings, the choir is getting in one last practice before service begins.

Music begins to fill the air as our pianist settles in at the grand piano. You won't find an order of service, but not to worry! We use a projection screen at the front of the sanctuary to guide our worship. Here you will find the words to our hymns, responsive readings and prayers.

Worship leaders use our audio system to ensure all are able to comfortably hear the messages they have prepared.

On select Sundays after service, we gather in our 'Friendship Hall' on the lower level for coffee and tea and friendly conversation.

God's spirit of love and community is in this place and we look forward to welcoming you to St. John's in beautiful Port Perry.
